adjective

Essential Basics

**Definition**  
having the usual qualities of a particular type of person or thing

**Synonyms**  
normal usual standard

**Antonyms**  
atypical unusual extraordinary

"It was a **typical** Monday morning."

## 2 Adjacent

adjective

Essential Basics

**Definition**  
situated next to or near something else

**Synonyms**  
adjoining neighbouring bordering

**Antonyms**  
distant remote separate

"The shop is **adjacent** to the library."

## 3 Hilarious

adjective

Essential Basics

**Definition**  
extremely funny, arousing great laughter

**Synonyms**  
amusing funny comical

**Antonyms**  
serious sad boring

"The comedy show was **hilarious**."

## 4 Sufficient

adjective

Essential Basics

**Definition**  
adequate for the purpose, enough to meet a need or requirement

**Synonyms**  
adequate enough ample

**Antonyms**  
insufficient inadequate lacking

"We have **sufficient** food for everyone."

## 5 Probable

adjective

Essential Basics

**Definition**  
likely to be true or to happen, supported by evidence but not certain

**Synonyms**  
likely expected anticipated

**Antonyms**  
improbable unlikely doubtful

"It is **probable** that it will rain tomorrow."

## 6 Stunning

adjective

Beauty and Appearance

**Definition**  
breathtakingly beautiful or remarkable

**Synonyms**  
beautiful magnificent impressive

**Antonyms**  
ordinary plain unattractive

"The view from the top of the hill was **stunning**."

## 7 Enchanting

adjective

Beauty and Appearance

**Definition**  
charming or attractive, so much that it is almost magical

**Synonyms**  
charming captivating delightful

**Antonyms**  
unappealing repulsive dull

"The **enchanting** garden was full of flowers."

## 8 Picturesque

adjective

Beauty and Appearance

**Definition**  
visually attractive, especially in a quaint way

**Synonyms**  
scenic charming attractive

**Antonyms**  
ugly unattractive drab

"The **picturesque** village had colourful cottages and a stream running thro..."

**9 Exquisite** adjective

**Beauty and Appearance**

**Definition**  
wonderfully crafted and stunningly lovely

**Synonyms**  
elegant perfect sublime

**Antonyms**  
crude ordinary ugly

"The exquisite painting in the museum was covered in tiny, delicate brush..."

**10 Grotesque** adjective

**Beauty and Appearance**

**Definition**  
ugly or unnatural in a way that causes disgust

**Synonyms**  
distorted unnatural hideous

**Antonyms**  
beautiful attractive elegant

"The sculpture was grotesque."

**11 Gloomy** adjective

**Light and Darkness**

**Definition**  
dim, sad and without cheer

**Synonyms**  
dark dim dreary

**Antonyms**  
sunny cheerful bright

"The gloomy castle looked haunted."

**12 Kindle** verb

**Emotions and Feelings - Part 1**

**Definition**  
to set something on fire, to light, arouse or inspire

**Synonyms**  
ignite light arouse

**Antonyms**  
extinguish quench dampen

"The speech kindled hope in everyone."

**13 Luminous** adjective

**Light and Darkness**

**Definition**  
shining brightly, giving off light

**Synonyms**  
shining radiant glowing

**Antonyms**  
dull dark dim

"The luminous stars lit up the sky."

**14 Virtuous** adjective

**Moral Concepts**

**Definition**  
having or showing high moral standards; morally good

**Synonyms**  
righteous moral upright

**Antonyms**  
wicked corrupt immoral

"She lived a virtuous life helping others."

**15 Integrity** noun

**Moral Concepts**

**Definition**  
the quality of being honest and having strong moral principles

**Synonyms**  
honesty honour uprightness

**Antonyms**  
dishonesty deceit corruption

"The head teacher was admired for her integrity."

**16 Righteous** adjective

**Moral Concepts**

**Definition**  
morally right or justifiable

**Synonyms**  
virtuous moral just

**Antonyms**  
wicked immoral sinful

"She fought for righteous causes."

## Affluent

adjective

Wealth and Money

**Definition**  
wealthy, having a lot of money or possessions

**Synonyms**  
wealthy prosperous rich

**Antonyms**  
poor impoverished destitute

"They lived in an **affluent** neighbourhood."

## Bankrupt

adjective

Wealth and Money

**Definition**  
unable to pay what you owe

**Synonyms**  
insolvent ruined broke

**Antonyms**  
prosperous wealthy solvent

"In the board game, the player went **bankrupt** after buying too many prop..."

## Hoard

verb

Wealth and Money

**Definition**  
gather and hide away large amounts of things

**Synonyms**  
stockpile save amass

**Antonyms**  
distribute squander donate

"Dragons are known to **hoard** treasure."

## Tranquil

adjective

Conflict and Peace

**Definition**  
peaceful and calm

**Synonyms**  
serene peaceful calm

**Antonyms**  
chaotic turbulent hectic

"The **tranquil** lake reflected the mountains."

## Serenity

noun

Conflict and Peace

**Definition**  
the state of being calm and peaceful

**Synonyms**  
peace tranquility calmness

**Antonyms**  
chaos turmoil agitation

"The garden provided a sense of **serenity**."

## Propel

verb

Speed and Movement - Part 1

**Definition**  
drive or push something forward

**Synonyms**  
drive push thrust

**Antonyms**  
impede obstruct restrain

"The wind **propelled** the boat forward."

## Frivolous

adjective

Humour and Seriousness

**Definition**  
not having a serious purpose, meaning or value

**Synonyms**  
trivial superficial insubstantial

**Antonyms**  
serious important practical

"Stop wasting time on **frivolous** activities."

## Stern

adjective

Humour and Seriousness

**Definition**  
firm and showing no sign of softness

**Synonyms**  
firm strict severe

**Antonyms**  
relaxed friendly gentle

"She gave him a **stern** warning."

## 25 Amused 😊

adjective

Humour and Seriousness

### Definition

finding something funny or entertaining

### Synonyms

entertained delighted tickled

### Antonyms

bored unamused serious

"The children were **amused** by the clown's antics."


